Signs and Symptoms of Exposure

Dizziness, nausea

Medical Conditions Generally Aggravated by Exposure

Vomiting, diarrhea, irritation to eyes, nose, and throat.

May contribute to allergies.

Emergency and First Aid Procedures

For skin exposure, wash well with soap and water for 15 minutes.

For eye exposure, flush with copious quantities of water, and get medical attention..

For inhalation, remove to fresh air and give oxygen if breathing is difficult.

For ingestion, do not induce vomiting, get medical attention immediately.

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Section VII - Precautions for Safe Handling and Use

Steps to Be Taken in Case Material is Released or Spilled

Use absorbent material to soak up spill. Dike area if needed. Ventilate area, mop up material and dispose of material properly. Take hazard precautions in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations.

Waste Disposal Method

Dispose of material in accordance with local, state and federal regulations

Materials may be recycled.

Precautions to Be Taken in Handling and Storing

Store tight containers in cool, well-ventilated area.

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Other Precautions

If large quantities are involved, use safety shower and eyewash fountain.
